Objectives for Encouraging Sustainable and Safe Movement

Our Neighbourhood Plan needs clear objectives for improving the way we move around the area. In particular we need to consider traffic management to reduce the impact of vehicles, deliveries and public transport on pollution, noise, accidents and the quality of our city spaces.

- The number of vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians on our roads will increase with the opening of Crossrail 1&2 and possible changes to Oxford Street
- We are fortunate to have excellent public transport, but buses emit dangerous diesel fumes
- Public health is damaged by vehicles emitting noxious fumes and fine particles of dust called particulate matter
- Cyclists and pedestrians suffer if priority is given to traffic. Accident rates for pedestrians and cyclists are too high
- Deliveries cause congestion and noise, especially at anti-social hours
- Too much public space is given over to traffic that need not enter the West End
